WANNOCK AVENUE TRAFFIC CALMING

The original proposal for traffic calming along Wannock Avenue outside of Willingdon Primary School was agreed about ten years ago in that the developer would make a contribution towards the traffic calming scheme. After a long battle with the developer about the promised funding, East Sussex County Council has finally been able to access the secure bond and the scheme is completing.

CARRIAGEWAY AND FOOTWAY PATCHING

East Sussex County Council's highways have confirmed that the following works will take place:

- patching between numbers 119,117,111,107, 56 and 52 Eastbourne Road ,
- footway re-surfacing along Coopers Hill from Portsdown Way northbound toward the A2270 for 60m,
- footway patching at Anderida Road at the junction with Seven Sisters Road
- Carriageway patching in front of the block garages in Wenthill Gardens.
- Patching footway on Broad Road between Eastbourne Road to Coppice Avenue beginning on 3 September 2012.

VIBRATION FROM HEAVY VEHICLES

Many residents in Seven Sisters Road, Gorrington Valley Road and Coppice Avenue have been experiencing vibrations from heavy vehicles which are made worse when they are exceeding the speed limit.

A Seven Sisters Road resident has kindly taken the trouble to talk to other neighbours and has confirmed that others are also experiencing similar problems with vibrations from heavy vehicles. Many residents appear to believe the problem is exclusive to their properties but in fact the issue is affecting many.
