If the covenant was removed there was a possibility that the land would be used for other purposes which were not educational or related to natural history preservation.</p> <p>It was resolved to object strongly and emphasise that the covenant should NOT be removed. 	<p>obligation date 30th April 2009 in relation to WD/2007/1054/MEA and WD/2011/2486/MFE</p> <p>The clerk informed the committee that she had obtained copies of the equipped children's play space that the developers were providing under the condition as advised by Ms McIntyre of Wealden District Council. The buffer areas were to be managed by the developers appointed management company. It was also expected that the removal of item iii would be removed from the discharges, however this was not certain. The committee discussed the need for adult and youth play space and that if the developer could not provide that then the commuted sum could be used by the council to provide something for adult and youth. The Chair of planning stated that the sum was considerable and amounted to a total of over half a million pounds and that included over £240,000 for adult and youth play space. He stated that he did not believe that the commuted sum should be discharged. The committee agreed.</p> <p>It was resolved to submit objections and comment that "The Town Council accept that the developers have provided onsite play areas for the children items i and ii and that the buffer areas will be completed and managed by the management company. However, item iii youth and adult playing space value in the region of £240,000 has not been provided on site and the item should NOT be discharged. There must be confirmation that as per the s106 agreement the money will be used within the Polegate boundary for adult and youth playing space." Although this item was incomplete the committee discussed the traffic issues surrounding the entrance and possible collisions when the new Kitewood entrance was created. A number of councillors expressed their concerns about the width of the road within the site and some possible boundary issues at the front and rear of the road leading to the site.</p> <p>It was resolved to submit comments to the case officer as follows: "Although has been marked as incomplete, The Town Council would like to comment on the traffic issues, boundary and access issues.
