## POLEGATE TOWN — COUNCIL TAX

Polegate Town Council are pleased to announce that with no cuts in services within Polegate, Councillors have set a prudent budget and not increased the precept. This means the town council portion of your council tax bill will have a tiny increase of 28 pence per Band D Household. The slight increase is due to the tax base reductions set by Wealden District Council.

### Honey Farm, Eastbourne Road, Polegate

Polegate Town Council is pleased to confirm that, following a meeting of Wealden District Council (WDC) Planning Sub Committee South on Thursday 10 December 2009, the application by Pelham Holdings Ltd to develop 520 dwellings at Honey Farm was refused.

Over 1000 objections were registered on the WDC website and Town, District and County Councillors spoke against the application.

Thanks to all members of the public who have attended meetings or registered their objections. As a cautionary note, the planning process incorporates a right of appeal and the applicant may yet exercise this right.
