## Honey Farm appeal dismissed

As you may already be aware, the Secretary of State has dismissed Pelham Homes' appeal against Wealden District Council's rejection of their plans to build more than five hundred houses on the Honey Farm site. This represents a significant victory in the battle to prevent the over development of Polegate, and is due in no small part to residents, town councillors and other bodies, who worked tirelessly to gather and present evidence to the enquiry.

The ribbon was cut by Jayne Bigsby, former Polegate Town Councillor and the leading light of the Polegate Strollers walking club, and the short opening ceremony was attended by the Mayor, Councillors and Town Hall staff, and representatives of Sussex Police.



## Remembering our Forces

Polegate honoured the military in June, with two services to mark Armed Forces Day, which this year fell on Saturday the 25th June. On Monday the 20th, representatives of the British Legion, the Royal Air Force Association, Polegate Town Mayor Tim Voyce, Councillors and members of the public gathered to witness the raising of the Armed Forces Flag. The Reverend David Cook led the service and reminded those assembled of the debt owed to our armed forces, and particularly to those men and women who have lost their lives in the service of their country. A further short service was held on the 27th June, during which the flag was lowered.

## Quarry plans withdrawn

In our last newsletter we focused upon plans put forward by Haulaway Ltd to fill Filching Quarry with inert building material over a five year period, and urged our readers to voice their objections to the plan. We are pleased to announce that the company has withdrawn its application and the infilling will not now take place.
